

Kickapoo Tribal District Court STANDARD VISITATION SCHEDULE

The non-custodial parent shall have visitation with the minor child of the parties as follows:

REGULAR VISITATION

Every other weekend from 6 pm Friday until Monday at 9:00 a.m.

HOLIDAY VISITATION

In odd numbered years (ie: 1995, 1997, etc.) the non-custodial parent shall have visitation on the following schedule of holidays:

Easter:	6 pm Saturday preceding Easter until 6 pm Sunday
July 4:	6 pm evening preceding July 4 until 6 pm on July 4
Thanksgiving:	6 pm evening preceding Thanksgiving until 6 pm Sunday
Christmas:	6 pm day school is out until 10 pm Christmas Eve

In even numbered years (ie: 1996, 1998, etc.) the non-custodial parent shall have visitation on the following schedule of holiday:

Memorial Day:	6 pm Friday preceding Memorial Day until 8 pm Monday
Labor Day:	6 pm Friday preceding Labor Day until 8 pm Monday
Christmas:	12 noon Christmas Day until 8 pm January 1

The holiday visitation schedule set out above is to be observed whether or not it coincides with the regular every other weekend visitation schedule and is in addition thereto. However, it is intended that the holidays alternate between custodial and non-custodial parents. Therefore, on those occasions when non-custodial visitation shall not take place.

SPECIAL VISITATION

With respect to Father's Day and Mother's Day, if Father's Day falls on a weekend schedule for maternal visitation, the child shall be returned to the father by 10 am on Sunday until 8 pm. If Mother's Day falls within a weekend not schedule for her visitation, the child shall be returned to the mother by 10 am on Sunday until 8 pm.

SUMMER VISITATION

The non-custodial parent shall have summer visitation from 8 am June 15 until 8 pm June 30 and from 8 am August 1 until 8 pm August 15.

It is important to be aware that this visitation schedule is for the purpose of providing assured minimum amounts of visitation between non-custodial parent and child. Visitation should EXCEED the number of occasions set out herein. In addition, liberal telephone communications between non-custodial parent and child are encouraged and should occur.
